We create the **first digital database** of both online and offline private and public collections in Europe which testify to the survival of various forms of cultural opposition in the former socialist countries.

We show **how these collections work**, what functions they serve in their respective societies, and how they represent their holdings and findings to the national and international public.

0.1 About

Eastern Archive, initiated in 1987, is a project of collecting testimonies of former Polish citizens, repressed by the Soviet Union after the 1939, imprisoned, resettled, etc. Their remembrance was excluded from official view of the past, but remained in private circles. At the end of the Peoples' Republic it became possible to make it more public. Eastern Archive, founded in Warsaw, has had its branches in several cities in Poland and abroad (Moscow, New York, London). Testimonies have been recorded and in most cases transcribed. People have also been encouraged to write the testimonies on their own and send it the archive. Eastern Archive consists as well copies of personal records of former Polish citizens repressed by the Soviet Union. There are also artefacts, created during persecutions (like spoons, object of religious significance, etc.).



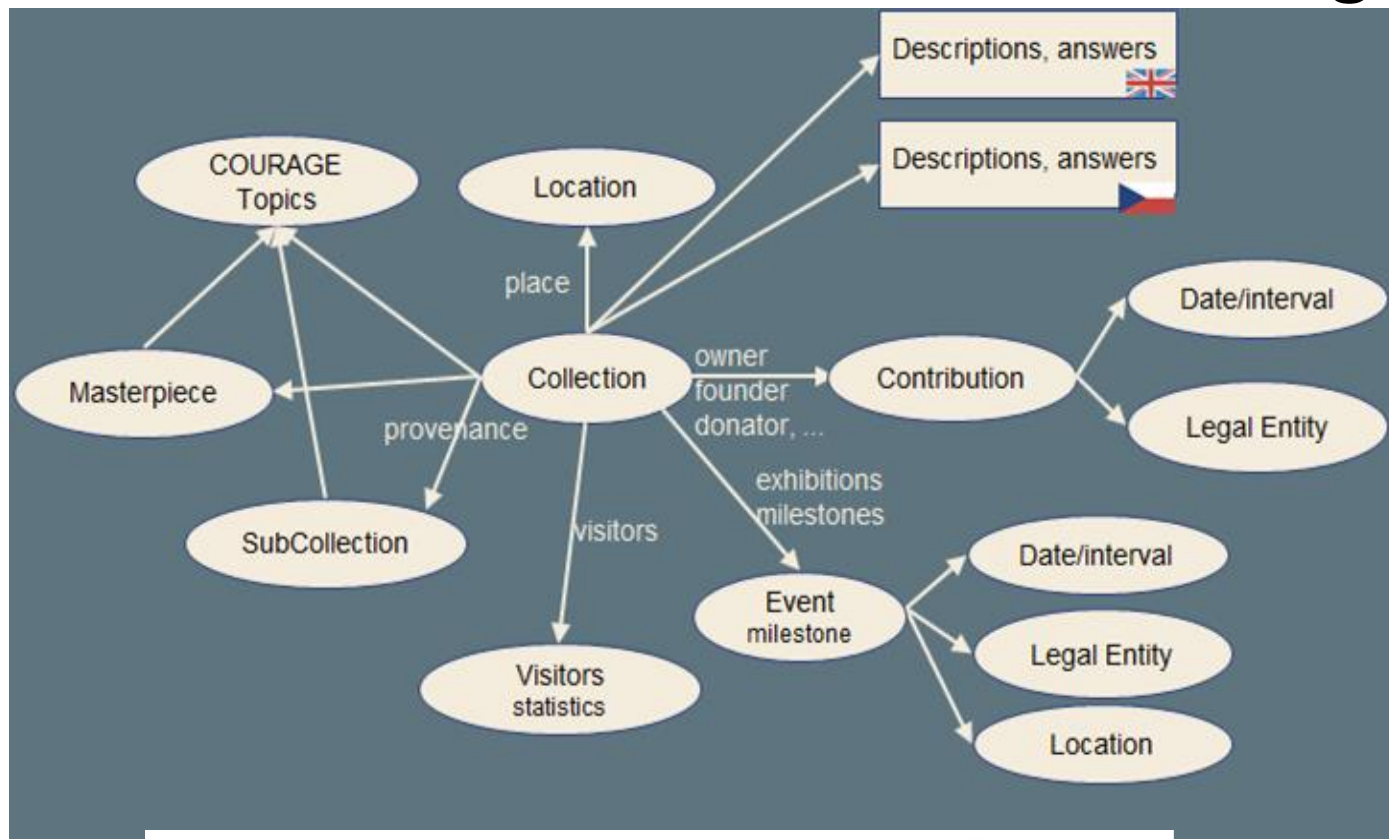

Linked Data schema in COURAGE Registry



- Both DOI and ORCID
- Connection between the two in exportable xml files
- Goal: enhance findability, identify researcher
- Struggle to introduce ORCID
- Questions re DOI:

 - Collection? Event? Person? Every entity that is a separate linked data entry?
 - Related to definition of valuable scientific work
 - Will such entries in databases be recognized as valuable scientific products? Now or later?

Abstract

A kutatás a magyarországi BV intézményeiben fogvatartottak re-szocializációs aspektusait kívánta megismerni, abból a szemszögből, ahogy maguk a résztvevők látják. A kutatás célja annak feltárása volt, hogy az első alkalommal végrehajtandó szabadságvesztésre ítélt, 30 éven aluli, rövid büntetési tételű (3 évig terjedő) férfiaknak milyen szubjektív esélyei és lehetőségei vannak a civil társadalomba való visszatérésre. Mindezt a létező szocializációs terek (család, társas viszonyok, munkaerőpiac és társadalmi környezet) kontextusában vizsgálták a kutatók. Kiemelt hangsúlyt helyeztek a vizsgálatban az egyéni attitűdök, motivációk és értelmezések körére, amelyek a reszocializációs folyamatokat segítő és gátló tényezők feltárását segítik elő. A vizsgálat lefolytatásához a résztvevőkkel interjúkat készítettek szabadulásuk előtt 6 hónappal, és szabadulásukat követően szintén 6 hónappal. Ezzel az utánkövetéses vizsgálattal megismerhetővé váltak a résztvevők várakozásainak és a ténylegesen megvalósuló szubjektív élethelyzetüknek értelmezési keretei.

A gyűjtemény az anonimizált interjúkat tartalmazza eredeti illetve atlas.ti programmal feldolgozott változatban. Az anonimizálás leírását a KDK nem nyilvános felületén dokumentáltuk.

The current research study aimed to map the re-socialization potentials of inmates held in Hungarian penal institutions from their own perspectives. The basic goal was to establish that to what degree do first-time offender males under the age of 30 and convicted to a relatively short period of time (up to 3 years) possess subjective chances in relation to their eventually successful reintegration into mainstream society. The topic was examined within the context of the existing venues for socialization – the family, social relations, labor market, and the social environment.

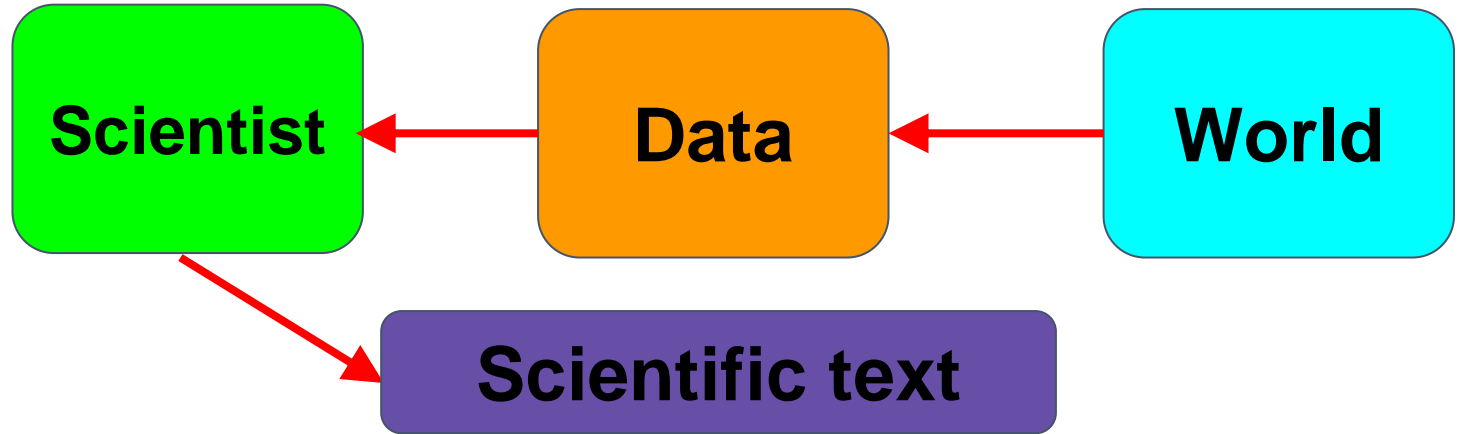
Special attention was being paid to individual attitudes, motivations, and interpretations, which collectively support to shed light on the identification of factors hindering and ushering re-socialization. The research was carried out through personal interviews with the participants six months prior and six months after their release. Such a follow-up study permitted the gaining of accurate insights on the participants' expectations and the subjective interpretation of their actual life conditions.

The collection contains the anonymised interviews in two versions: one of them the original, the other is processed by atlas.ti. Description of anonymization is available in the KDK.

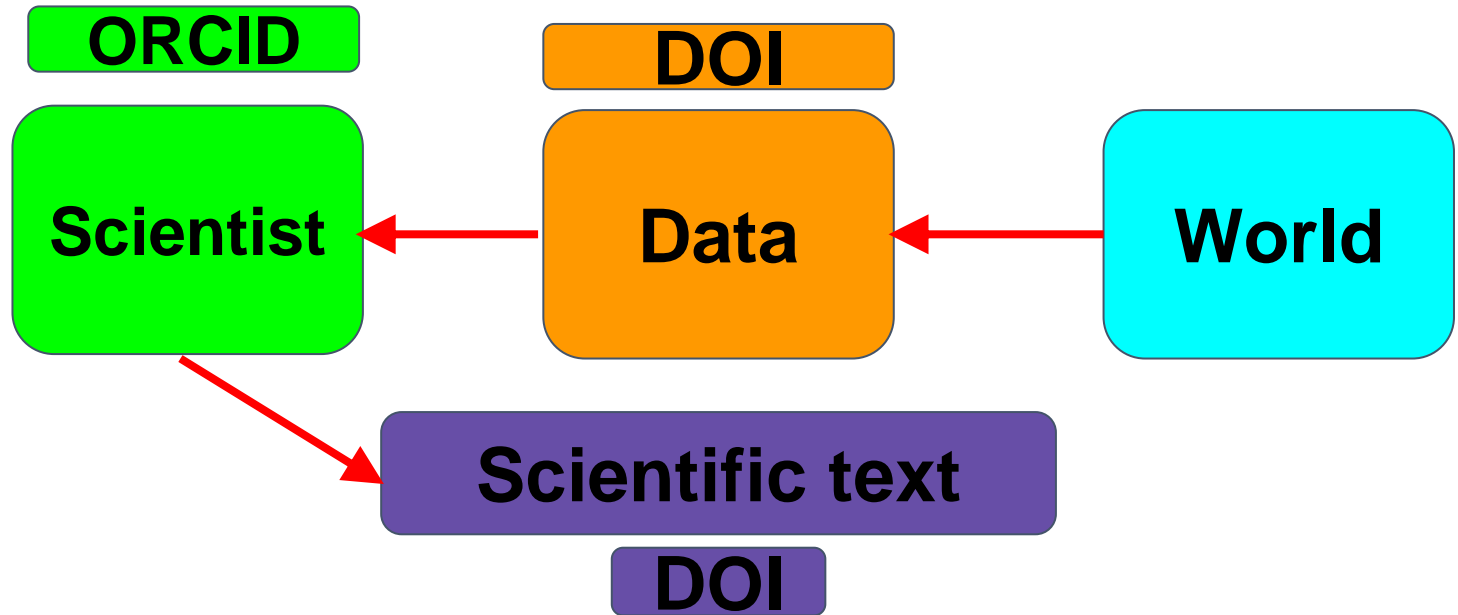

 - not always on each material, for example books, articles
- Curators can change content (files, metadata) with a mouseclick → XML provided for DOI will not be symmetrical with the record in registry

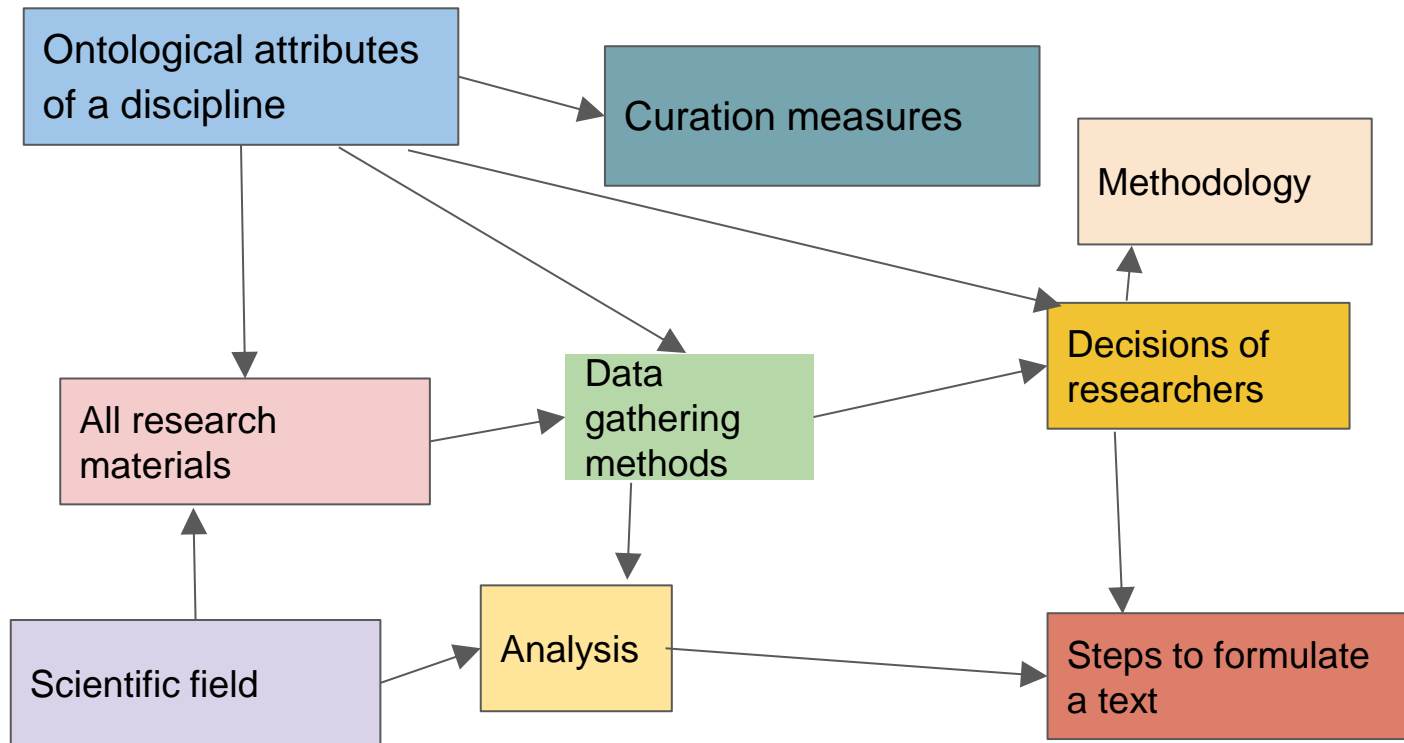

Purpose of social scientific data archiving

- reproducibility
- scientific control of results and methods
- cheap research material
- transparency
- identification

Purpose of social scientific data archiving

- Reproducibility – not (easily/at all) feasible, data not understandable (sometimes to some fellow scientists, at maximum)
- Control of results and methods – we need research whether this is feasible, in different disciplines
- Cheap research material ✓
- Transparency – not feasible
- Identification (with PIDs) – limitations; and if stable, widely used and monopolistic system

DOI – Persistent Identifier?

1.

- XMLs do not necessary reflect the current metadata of the collection
- DOIs do not change, but metadata can – policy of „closing” a digitally editable collection. Research does not stop.
- Linked Data – when is an entity ready for a DOI?

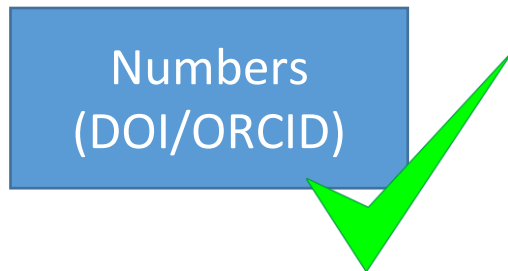
